<p>ENGLISH</p>	<p>Fiction Unit – Fantastic Voyages – Building Vocabulary, role-play retelling stories, writing alternative tales, diary entries, postcards and longer narratives, revise the use of ‘and’ to join sentences.</p> <p>Poetry Unit – Growing up – Comparing poems, discussing feelings, Identifying similarities and differences, creating a class poem and individual poems.</p> <p>Non-Fiction Unit - Top Jobs – What’s the best job? Finding information, new vocabulary, fact files, job applications, instruction texts.</p>
<p>MATHS</p>	<p>Add three numbers, add and subtract 10 to and from 2-digit numbers; compare weights/capacities; measure lengths; recognise halves and quarters of shapes; know recognise, name and know value of coins 1p–£2 and £5 and £10 notes; make equivalent amounts using coins; find change from 20p up to £1; count in 2s, 5s and 10s; know these times tables and more; tell the time to the half hour and quarter hour on analogue clocks and begin to read these times on digital clocks.</p>
<p>SCIENCE</p>	<p>Sound and Hearing: Identify sounds, types of sounds, how we hear, how sounds are important for safety (e.g. alarms), volume, animal sounds, musical instrument sounds.</p> <p>Pushes and Pulls: Things that move, describing movement, identify push/pull movements, wind power, Isaac Newton, how our bodies move.</p>
<p>HISTORY</p>	<p>Seaside Holidays Long Ago: Identify differences between ways of life at different times, our holidays, what we do, where we go, holidays in the past - clothes, games, activities, swimwear fashion, souvenirs. Comparing old and new photographs.</p>
<p>GEOGRAPHY</p>	<p>Our World: Name and locate the world’s seven continents and five oceans; use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as other countries, the continents and oceans.</p>
<p>COMPUTING</p>	<p>Coding: Learn that when a computer does something it is following instructions called code. Learn how to program objects to move.</p>
<p>ART</p>	<p>Round weaving Discovering the wonderful world of textile design and what it has to offer creatively. Looking at different weaving techniques. Exploring different types of threads and wool. Workshop with artist Jessica Mason and spinning wheel demonstration. The final outcome will be displayed in the EAW exhibition.</p> <p>Expressive Arts Week: project based on the theme ‘Wheels and Technology’.</p>



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DT	Where does it live? Entering the final stage of our two terms long project. Focusing on making by applying all the findings from our previous investigations. Learning about finishing techniques.
RE	Continuing Jewish festivals: Hanukkah, Passover, Seder plate, Moses and the Burning Bush, Special places, churches, visiting a church.
FRENCH	We will continue with the Skoldo elementary book, looking at the topics of parts of the body, hobbies and ice cream.
MUSIC	Exploring Beat Maintaining a steady beat Creating simple rhythms Naming and recognizing instruments
